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## Forgotten Nazi crimes to be remembered

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT

Of all the apalling crimes committed by the Nazis during their control of Germany from 1932 onwards, and their control of most of Europe during the second world war, one goes scandalously and officially unmourned—the murder in concentration camps of thousands of homosexual men and women.

Every sector of German society victimised by the Nazi regime is commemorated by official cenotaphs at the concentration camps where the atrocities took place. except homosexuals.

Each year, representatives of all minorities oppressed by the Nazis who have communities in this country remember the sufferings of their lost brethren by laying a wreath at the cenotaph in Whitehall at a ceremony the day followinf Rememberance Sunday.

The homophile community is the only group which so far has not been represented. This year, however, we will be: The Gay Liberation Front, and the Campaign for Homosexual Equality are to arrange a deputation to lay a wreath at the cenotaph along with other minorities.

Let it be made clear that this is to be a 'distinctly dignified' assembly, one that no person with the real interests of the homophile community at heart would deny this very pious act of remembrance would give less than the fullest support, and many more would feel it their duty to attend the wreath laying.

# From now on we've got a campaign to fight!

As we all know, the 'strong to heavywieght reaction to the permissive society' predicted by Roger Baker in the first issue of Lunch had already got into a fairly swing between the srticle being written and our going to print, which as much as anything shows how events can run faster than the media can follow them.

However, the fact that a reaction might be under way has given many people the opportunity to see how weak the homophile movement really is, both in number and, in some respects, morale.

Far too often in the past we have deceived ourselves that the then state of affairs was going to last for ever; and far too often deceived ourselves that ignorance, prejudice and sadism in public life would dwindle away, that whiplash Sandys and the devil would be excorsised by the weight of the 'permissive' society.

But they haven't, and once again we have to face their viciousness-this time, though, they have a difficult job on their hands.

Each and every attack on homosexuals which has had any success has found it not in the strength of the attackers, but in our weakness.

Pre- 1967 the weakness was understandable; those who fought for the few liberties we now enjoy deserve the highest praise for having taken enormous risks. Now there is no escuse for weaknessunder the law we have little to lose. Public declarations will do far more good to gain us support than any problems that might be used by the few, and they will be few, antagonists we find.

Telling people about ourselves is half the problem we face. The other half will have to be fought. The fighting has already started—we have had a few preliminary skirm—ishes in Burnley and the like which have shown us that we need to marshall our strength, and above all to show us that what we really need is a CAMPAIGN.

Lets get the CAMPAIGN for Homosexual Equality under way. Every member of CHE has his or her part to play. What one person can achieve can be seen by taking Mike Winter of the East London Group as an example.

Apart from his initiative, all Mike had to start with was a little courage- so mething which most of us have in plenty, but which we all too rarely put to good use.

Here is a list for action; if all our readers put these suggestions into action then CHE could soon become a fact that few might care to ignore. If we can be seen to be helping ourselves, surely we can hope to draw more support from our friends.

I Get all your friends to join CHE Wrod of mouth is the very best form of advertising- and you can do the job far far better than any expensive printed material.

2 Like the fact or not, many in the public service are corrupt when it comes to dealing with Gays. So is the judiciary; they know that there is no equivalent of the Cat Lovers League to look after us, and therefor feel safe to kick you in the shit. Never forget that all these persons are answereble to Parliament, and that your MP is, in the end answerable to his constituentsand that's you! No MP worth his salt is going to offend a millitant 5% block of voters, especially in a marginal constituency. Your MP is, then, particularly vulnerable to pressure. But if there is none. then he is liable to kick you in the shit at request of any other amenity group that cares to ask. Therefore- write to your MP and let him know you are a homosexual and that you are discontent with the present situation. If you belong to a Group, get them all to write to their MPs. Nothing worries an MP more than to receive a large number a letters over a period of time.

3 Your local councillors are another target for pressure, though less important than MPs, do have some say in what goes on in your area and many of them become magistrates in due course, so they are worth while spending time on to educate. Note that they seldom have more than 15% of the total vote each, so that it will pay to be discrete with them. Nonetheless, careful planning could lead to dividends.

4 The press we all know, are cretins, but they do matter; they often reflect the balance of power between the various factions in our Society. The press the homophile community gets nationally is quite apalling, locally often wicked and extremely damaging, all this not just to our cause alone, but to those who read these lies.

You must write to both the rational and the local press to let them know of our views and correct them on the multitude of mistakes they continually make. Never write anonymously, it carries no weight. Writing as a group is sometimes easier, and of course would let the public know about us.

Support all activites of all homophile groups wherever you can. Never forget that we gain greater strength from numbers. It is worth taking time off to attend special events- what you get is a big boost for morale and an idea of just what we are up against. If you travel out of London to any public event you give the Gays a great deal of encouragement by helping them stand their ground.

"What Homosexuals Think of Women" bt Pat Barr in this month's Nova, seems a very fair and informative article, presented coolly and sympathetically. It is no longer

necessary to have such fronts and I think its a popular misconception that should finally be laid low that two women together present a pathetic sight—the lowest social order. Who knows, they may actually enjoy each other's company.

## New bureau first of its type in UK

This is the first bona fide organisation of its kind in Great Britain. It is run for those who are lonely, shy or afraid of exploitation. It caters for people who, even in clubs, just never seem to meet the right companions.

It cuts out some of the preamble to meet people who, from the word go, share similar interests. Clients range from psychiatrists & nurses to sheet metal workers and garage managers. All information is regarded as strictly confiden-

tial. Applicants complete a simple questionaire.

Jane Lindsay who runs it is 26 and Gay herself. She founded GIB in June this year; the idea first occured to her when she was a disc jockey in darkest Africa, where the scene is indeed black for homosexuals. A few clients are bisexual, but basically GIB is only for the Gay, not the kinky.

Already 150 have registered, and she has twice that number pending registration. 80% of the clients so satisfactorily been paired. There is a pen pal group operating to the USA. They have had 'phone calls from Los Angeles, and queries from Bahrein, and branches are being set up in France and Italy soon.

GIB has been featured in all the female homosexual publications. As well as the Daily Mirror and Time Out, it also advertises regularly in The Times.

The Nationwide Festival of Light was a huge success, that is a success for the ardent followers of Mrs Whitehouse, Messrs Longford, Muggeridge & Co. But why?. Perhaps because only 35,000 people instead of the expected 100,000 attended?. Though I'm sure that their dissenters stayed at home for good 'Christian' reasons - thinking perhaps that 35,000 'Christians' versus a few score of Festival of Lifers was a fairer match.

Of the anti-porn brigade that did attend there were those amongst them I'm sure who felt devoutly 'Christian', as they sang with right arms raised, and tolerated the brutal harrasment of, and subsequent arrest of several members of the Gay Liberation Front. It is hard for me to comprehend how the teachings of Christ can ever be reconciled to acts of repression. And this surely will be the outcome if the NFOL pro clamations to the Government are ever translated into law. For proclamations of this kind upon acceptance will immediately stifle all opposing views, or morals held by other sections of the community, leading no doubt eventually to a society in which only the official or established views can be written, tele vised or given public performance; in other words - to a society like that of the Soviet Union, or worse still to that of a fascist suciety.

Many people have been concerned with the evils of moral pollution; I'll quote the words of one such man, who not too long ago spotted the need for a 'clean-up':

"If we do not lift the youth out of the morass of their present-day environment, they will drown in it."

How much better to meet someone and settle down instead of going from one to the other, as if sex were our most important need.

Are we sexually hung up that this is all we need? I'l find that one true man is all I'ldwant. We've all been hurt, so let's start reorganising our lives this way- the way I think most people want it anyway.

We are not in a position to ask any thing of the public when we cannot even sort ourselves out.

## Housing Drive

One practical and effective way homosexuals can take advantage of provisions made for Mr & Mrs Average Citizen is to for housing group. These provide great advantages over individual effort in the jungle warfare known as the housing market.

Black mortgages of 90-100% are negotiable over a much greater period
than is available to individuals,
making the cost of deposit and
repayment less. However, the ressulting houses are usually leased to
members and on resale only a proportion of the profit arising from
an increase in value is paid to
the owner.

Several forms of housing groups are possible. Those which we would probably find most useful are:

1 A group formed to convert, say, a large old house into flats, or several houses into maisonettes. Under Section 119 of the Housing Act (1957) money may be borrowed for both purchase and convertion for up to 50 years.

2 A Housing Society Group which, following the rules of the Housing Corporation, London SW1, is able to buy land and build on it with a 100% mortgage over 40 years. Finance from this source is guaranteed.

3 Other groups can be housing associations affiliated to the National Federation of Housing Societies at 86 Strand WC2, but here there is no guarantee of finance always being available. Naturally, the groups plans must be approved by the society through which finance is obtained. To form a housing group, advertise in Lunch, or use group meetings of CHE to gather together interested members; then write to either the Housing Corporation, Sloane Square House SW1, or to the National Federation of Housing Societies (as above) for full information.
