Matters arising from Minutes of previous meeting, 21st October

Connie will report back more fully at the next meeting, including the amount of publicity that we, as a group, will need to handle.

Leaflet: There was some discussion about a reference to 'Solidarnosc' in the leaflet which Clive had prepared. Discussion was hampered because neither Clive, nor the leaflet were present. The group agreed to delete any reference to 'Solidarnosc' in

order to avoid any sectarian antagonism (see Constitution).

24 hr. Picket o/s S.Africa House Nobody turned up as AA suggested nobody attend Dulais Trip Report Back Polly reported that £400 was handed over to the Dulais Support Group at the social on Saturday night at the Gnllwyn Miners Welfare Hall.

Their support group now produce and distribute a bulletin: 'The Valley Star' which published the fact of our visit and warmly received our support and the visit, Andy M. read out the relevant section from the 'Star. We were invited to visit them again anytime we wished. Polly was given a platform at a Miners rally on Saturday afternoon at which a thousand people had turned up to. Her speech received solid support both from the other speakers on the platform and the Miners, Women Against Pit Closures, Trade Unionists and others supporters present.

Dulais report back (Cont'd)

Andy Denn Addressed the people present at the social at the Onllwyn Welfare on Saturday evning. He expressed out total support for their struggle and talked about the important links that were being built during this historic strike. His contribution went down well with the three hundred people present. Ally Thomas, from the Dulais Support Group, thanked LGSM for our work and expressed the pleasure that it was bringing to their community in being able to meet us personally. Andy then presented them with £400. There was much merriment that evening and vast quantities of alcohol were consumed, much friendship extended between our group and the women and men of Dulais. Sunday morning we visited Treforgan Colliery and witnessed the appalling under investment at the mine. In the afternoon we attended their support group meeting. Mike J. gave a short message of solidarity and thanked them for their generous and warm hospitality. Tom Jones (Dulais) then presented us with a gift in recognition of our support (this was a gleaming piece of anthracite and a miniature Miners lamp mounted together on a wooden, varnished plinth). Dave Donovan addressed the meating just before we left to return to London. He reported that our visit had been a success in the eyes of the peeple of Dulais. In addressing those from his own community he said that LGSM members had been wearing NUM badges on our lapels for months now and that, as a mark of solidaity, they should wear our badges 'with respect and pride'.

Mark Ashton reported that the visit was the best experience of his life. (Mine too ! - MJ)

Ray G. reported that on Saturday 3rd Nov several members had the pleasure of meeting some of the Dulais people at a social in Green Lanes

Police Bill Campaign Paul Canning sent on a cheque that the campaign had given to us. It was agreed that part of this money would go towards the outstanding costs of the Public Meeting. Mike to write thanking them.
