Publicity Group Report. P.G. are trying to organise a lesbian and gay section on the Feb. 24th National Demonstration. The meeting unanimously agreed, in principle, to P.G. producing a pamphlet. The draft leaflet was read out and accepted with a few minor amendments - Lionel to arrange printing.

Mineworkers Defence Committee. Mike J. attended MDC meeting at County Hall on Tues (22nd). About ten people were present. Registrations for the Feb.9th Conference in Sheffield were looking good and they were confident that there would be a fully booked conference. The MDC weekly bulletin 'Black Dragon' was being mailed out to over 1,000 addresses and they are intending to get it distributed in left bookshops (price 30p).
