Dancing. Arising out of the minutes of previous

The Chairman stated that the
attendance was small considering the
large number of members of the club,
but perhaps it was something to be
thankful for as we should have had
great difficulty in accomodating all
our members in the games room.

He mentioned that the War Memorial
was still incomplete, despite the
efforts of Mr Cadogan to obtain the
information required. About 10 names
had been completed with their
regiments & there still remained
about 10 which were not complete.
He felt sure that if members would
try they could obtain the information
required.

. Having won the Desborough Cup
last year he was sure that members
intended to keep it. We could
only do this by each member
being thorough & sticking to a thing
once he decided to train for it.
Our position at the moment was
very favourable but we still had
the summer sports to compete in.
We had just won the 1st Aid Cup for
the first time & the club certainly
owed a debt of gratitude to Messrs
Girling & J. Toge for their ~~un~~
work on behalf of this team.

The punters had been most valuable
especially at the final cricket
match. It cheered & helped a
team greatly if it saw that
a number of its clubmates were
sufficiently interested to turn
out & witness the team's effort
to win an honour for the club.
Despite great unemployment &
the fact that one member

had withdrawn nearly £300 to commence business with - the deposits were £2761 against £2800 last year, a state of affairs that might be considered quite satisfactory.

Hospital Tickets & Dental Tickets were available for members or their families & could be had on application from the Managers or Secretary.

The competition for the House Shield was in a very interesting state & as there was very little between the leading & bottom House.

The method of collecting subscriptions that had been adopted last ~~sep~~ October had been successful. Members should understand that it was their duty to find their whips & pay their subscriptions to them & not to expect the whips to run round after each individual for his subscription. About 150 members had to be written to concerning arrears of subs. It should be

remembered & each member had asked to join the club & it was up to them to pay their sub.

Members who were out of work provided they reported on Tuesdays between 9.30 am & 3.30pm at the committee room, were not required to pay their Club subscription. This rule also applied to those who were still attending school & were unable to afford the subscription. The cleanliness & comfort of the club ^{were} ~~were~~ in the hands of the members. The older ones might greatly assist by firmly discouraging younger members from chalking on the walls or swinging on the hot water pipes in the dressing rooms.

With our large membership it was impossible to keep free from undesirables. There had been cases of theft from the dressing room & he strongly

advised members not to leave
valuables about.

Members were reminded that a
friend of the club was prepared to
give legal advice free of charge to
members & their friends. They
should communicate with himself or
Mr Cooper or by letter to the Club
Secretary & appointments would be
arranged.

Mr Cadogan now took the chair at 9.40
Mr Wellesley having to leave to attend
another meeting.

Library. The chairman asked members to
be more careful to bring books back
after they had borrowed them. The
number of books lost to the club through
the neglect of members to return them
was enormous. The average cost per
volume was about 6/- He considered
the club was deeply indebted to the
Librarians - J Mills, J Law, W Pennicott
& Sharp for the amount of work
they did for the library.

Cinema The cinema was now in
working order & he hoped that during
the winter members & their friends
would patronize it & make it pay its
way.

Mr Cooper spoke about the cricket & shooting -
he reminded the members that there was
something more than batting & bowling
in cricket. There was required a
willingness to assist & obey the captain,
a willingness to carry out & return
the nets & practice gear - not to
leave these matters to the one or two
who always helped in these things.

Rifle shooting practices would be held
on Monday & Tuesday evenings
till further notice. On Wednesday

evenings probable members for the
club team would be allowed to
practice with free ammunition.

The chairman asked if any
members wished to ask any
questions or make suggestions
to boat proposed that "no member

under 16 yrs of age should be eligible for the general committee," & Sharp proposed "that when a vacancy occurred on the committee at any time the new committee man should be elected by his House."

The Chairman stated that he could not be sure how these proposals might interfere with the present constitution of the club, & under the circumstances he thought it best - before a vote was taken - to inform the members, that their decision on these two motions would if carried be forwarded to the General Committee as an "expression of opinion of this meeting".

Both motions were then put (separately) & carried unanimously a proposal that this meeting elect a new general Committee was ruled out of order.

There being no further questions or suggestions - Mr Cadogan said -

"before the meeting breaks up, speaking on behalf of the managers of the clubs, I think the Club this year is doing remarkably well in the Desborough. We were about 20 points at the moment leading the second club in the competition by 10 points. We had however all the summer competitions to go through & we must remember the fable of the Hare & Tortoise." Everyone who intended to compete in any of the summer sports for the honour of the club must therefore stick hard at his training & not slack if they did this there could be no doubt as to the holders of the Desborough Cup for next year.

The chairman announced amidst much
applause, that we had won the Desborough
Cup for the second year in succession.
He explained the various details connected

It would be a great

pity if for want of numbers or for bad behaviour we were deprived of the use of the baths. The House Competition was started because the club was growing so large & there were only a comparative few who could represent the club in the Federation events. It was hoped that the stimulus provided by these competitions would result in new talent being unearthed & encouraged. The House Officials would readily see that they had exceptional opportunities for bringing to light the latent talent in their houses.

The Competition for the passed year had been won by Green House (Capt a Redgewell vice Capt J. Turrell). It was proposed that in honour of having won, Green House should hold a supper dinner on Saturday 15th & afterwards have the use of the Hall etc for the
