The Annual general meeting of the Boys Club was held in the main Hall at 8-30 pm. on Monday October 3rd. 1949. Mr. David Shan-Kennedy in the chair, supported by Sir Edward Cadogan, Mr. E.B. Barling, and Messrs. E.A. Wilson, G.H. Jackson, F.G. Lee, R.H. Hill, J.F. Perkins, B. Brooke, Hon. Secretaries and Instructors, and some 200 members.

Minutes of the previous A.G.M. were read, approved and signed. There was no business arising from the minutes. The Chairman in opening the meeting stated that all speakers would be limited to time, and then went on to remind members of all the many facilities available in the Club, referring in particular to the Club dental Clinic, and Savings Bank.

Sir Edward Cadogan who was the next speaker, then reminded members that in the absence of Mr. Vilhjalmur he was the oldest man aged present. He went on to describe the delights and advantages of the Warren Farm, and said that he hoped that it would be possible for the Club to run a week's Camp at the Warren Farm next summer, particularly for the boys in the 14-15 age group. Sir Edward congratulated members on a particularly good year in Federation and other competitions and said that he was also glad to notice that Brown &

man's Club, which was closely connected with Eton
man had also shown a very welcome revival.

Mr. E. B. Baring then spoke on the advantages of
the Warren Farm, and endorsed Sir Edwards remarks
on the value of a Summer Camp next year. He went
on to say that whilst his chief interest lay in the
Other section he was very pleased to learn of the
Club's success in all other branches of sport.

Referring to the others Mr. Baring said that whilst
it was a big disappointment to lose both team races
to Sulgrave, it was a welcome sign of increasing
interest shown in swimming by the other Clubs.
He referred to the magnificent performance put up by
the Old Boys Swimming section, and said that
the Boys Club must follow the example of the
older members. Mr. Baring concluded by wishing
the Club and members the very best of luck and
all successes during the coming year.

Mr. E. A. Wilson then addressed members, and
referred to the many successes, but said that what
gave the Club most concern was the number of boys
who had struck off, or who had left the Club.

He gave various reasons why boys leave, and said
that the chief reason was a lack of interest, or no

particular activity, unless a boy had some real
interest or incentive in the Club, then the Club could
not hope to do much, the activities, equipment, playing
fields, etc. were provided for members, it was up to the
members to make use of them. Mr. Wilson said that in
cases of real hardship the Club would always try to
help, but unless boys themselves came along to explain
their difficulties with subscriptions, little could be done.
He said there was no reason why members should get
in arrears with subscriptions, which were trivial
compared with that a boy would pay for a couple of
hours amusement in the cinema or dance hall. Mr. Wilson
said that the Club should be a second home for the
members, where they could meet their friends in bright,
friendly and cheerful surroundings.

Mr. G. Jackson in his opening remarks stated that he hardly
expected members to find his talk interesting, did people
want to be reminded about subscriptions, regular attendance
at the Dental Clinic, etc. But this had to be emphasized
each year, members were not co-operating fully in payment
of subscriptions, which meant much extra work in
the Club Office, and extra expense to members in
finances. Mr. Jackson then referred to slackness, and said
that there was no work in the Club for the boy who

just paid his subscriptions, and called himself a member, every member was expected to play his part in some activity. Various activities and interests were provided in the Club at considerable expense, solely for this benefit. Mr. Jackson then dealt with Trophies & Medals, and pointed out how important it was that Trophies should be returned to the Club as quickly as possible.

He also referred to the importance of the Club notice board, and said that this should be the first thing a member should look at on entering the Club. He also referred to care of equipment and gave examples of carelessness in this respect. Mr. Jackson closed by giving details of procedure for members who wished to make use of the Club Dental Clinic.

Mr. F. Lee then spoke on Football and said that the Club had met with its usual successes, and had turned out ten teams throughout the season, a record. The three Senior teams did quite well, first team Fed League winners & Cup finalists, Wastell & Wilson distinguishing themselves in representative matches, the former captaining the English team versus Scotland. Senior also won annual match versus Fairbairn Home. The Juniors were winners of the Fed Cup. The Sunday games for Juniors were a great success and would be continued this season.

Mr. R. Hill speaking on Cricket, said that all four teams had a good season. The Juniors winning all their Fed games, and also the Fed Cup. Juniors batting not quite up to average, but bowling & fielding very good. T. Jones distinguishing himself by taking 100 wickets in the season. The Seniors had one of their best seasons ever, winning all Federation games, and also the Cup, Batting fairly good, fielding poor, and bowling good. Beaumont a good captain, and also as batsman who scored over a thousand runs in the season. Playell also achieved the distinction of taking 100 wickets for the season. Wilson & Latham represented the Fed. at Hoods. Ted Lester congratulated on his coaching of Seniors. Banned teams had pleasant and enjoyable seasons, backing up the Senior and Junior teams, whilst the same remarks applied to the Junior reserve team.

Mr. G. Jackson, in the absence of Mr. Browning, spoke on Boxing, saying that generally speaking it was a successful, if unlucky year. The Club had 10 semi-finalists in the Fed, but through illness and other causes we only had two actual finalists. He referred to the outstanding success of L. Gold who was Federation champion, and who also reached the final of the A.B.A. Junior Championship. Mr. Jackson concluded by remarking that we needed more Junior Boxers to complete a really good section, and

also asking the boys from the Leyton area to give more support to the Boxing section as an activity.

Mr. E. Fadd dealt with the Swimming section, saying that the others were not only seeking champions, but also boys who could not swim or who were just beginners. He said we had better facilities and instructors than any other swimming club in London. It was up to the members to take advantage of them.

He congratulated those boys who had done well in the fed, including Flower, who had also won the Middlesex Junior championship. Edmonds & Fennell had represented Middlesex & Southern Counties at I.O.C.

Referring to the Federation swimming, Mr. Fadd said that although we won fewer individual events than expected, very fine team work had enabled us to win the competition, with a big percentage of seconds and thirds.

Mr. Shaw-Kennedy speaking of Physical Training, said that we had a really good class last year, and that the team were very unfortunate to lose the fed competition by one point only. He also made mention that there were ten members of Etos trained in the N.A.B.C. team which competed in the Lingiad in Sweden. He said that Physical Training was of immense value as a building

up, and strengthening method, for all games. Physical training was an activity which should appeal to all members, whether they were athletes, Boxers, Swimmers, footballers or even if it was their only chief activity. Mr. Hibberd's next spoke on First aid, saying what a wonderful opportunity First aid, and the knowledge gained, could be to all members. It was a great opportunity for members to be of service to their fellow members, and to the community. The team did very well in competition, losing the fed by a narrow margin. His concluding remarks were that he would like to see a little more keenness shown in the House competitions.

Mr. J. Lee dealt briefly with Squash and Tennis, and said that the Squash Courts were available on Tuesdays & Thursdays, he asked members to co-operate by washing their hands before playing and also to sweep the courts. Referring to Tennis, he said that coaching was available during the season, and asked members to remember to lower the net after playing. He said that members had a good season, with K. Beauchamp getting into the last eight of the Evening News competition.

Mr. L. Goldring spoke on the Harris section, saying that the Cross Country team did well, and were second

in the fed event. He referred to the track and equipment saying they were the best in the country, and appealed to members, particularly Juniors for more support. Mr. Golding thanked all the Old Boys for their great help in coaching. In saying that the Harriers were a "mating" crowd, he did not wish to infer that other sections were not, there were no limits to the number of members, all were welcome. Mr. Golding referred to the forthcoming house competitions saying that all houses must support this event, as the team for cross country would be chosen from this. In praising D. Cox for his efforts last season, Mr. Golding said he was an object lesson for all members, training and perseverance had put him in the top class of jumpers.

Mr. R. Field spoke of the activities of the Rugby section, saying that there were serious difficulties in running two teams, he appealed for more support from all boys who were unable to get a place in the other teams, and asked the swimmers and boxers to help them out. Mr. Field dispelled the feeling that Rugby was a rough game. Mr. J. Perkins dealing with Indoor activities referred to the successes of the Junior section run by Stan Johnson, saying that the Juniors had won the Federation competition and that the Seniors were runners up, and congratulated K. Blamire on gaining representative honours. Referring to

Dramatics, Mr. Perkins said we had a great reputation in the year before the war, we must try to get a strong team together this year, the Drama section would be commencing shortly under a first class instructor, and asked for a dozen keen boys to form the nucleus of the section. He then dealt with Chess & draughts saying that there would be coaching on Friday evenings, and inter club events. This was a good section for boys who were not good at other games. Mr. Perkins concluded by inviting members to take part in the art class activities, here he said we had a grand record over many years, with a wonderful instructor in Mr. W. Parsons. This could bring out the very best in boys with some aptitude. The Library, he said, was well stocked with books and publications of all kinds, and advised members to make more use of it.

Mr. Wilson then said that he would be failing in his duty if he did not thank the managers, particularly Mr. Jellies, for their magnificent generosity, help, and encouragement, in making the Club possible, without them there would never have been an Eton branch, it was up to all members to show them that all the work, and money they had put into the Club, was appreciated, he also thanked the staff on the Wilderness, and at the Club, for their grand work on behalf of the members. Mr. Shaw Kennedy in

bringing the meeting to a close, said the whole spirit of the Club depended upon the members, every one of whom must play his part by co-operating and joining in as many of the activities as possible. He then introduced the new house committees, the house captain each saying a few words. Mr. Shaw Kennedy then announced that Blue House had won the House competition shield, and presented this to R. Morgan, Blue House captain. He then announced that the Herbert House trophy for the best committee members had been awarded to A. Medgett, now serving in the Army, and presented the first aid trophy to Red House, winners of the House competition.

R. Clynes asked if the Club library could be opened more often, the Chairman said that this would be referred to the Library Committee. The meeting closed at 10 o'clock.

Boys Club annual General Meeting. 1950.

The annual general meeting of the Boys Club was held in the main Hall on Monday Evening, October 2nd 1950 Sir Edward Badoglio K.B.E. C.B. in the Chair supported by Hon A.G.C. Villiers, Mr. E.B. Baring, Mr. R.F. Shaw-Kennedy, Mr. B. Brook, the Executive Staff and Hon. Secretaries and Instructor, with over 200 members present.

Minutes of previous A.G.M. were read, approved, and signed by the Chairman. The Chairman in opening the meeting said he was delighted to take the Chair, and expressed his pleasure at the large attendance of members. He then introduced the respective House Captains, who introduced their House Committee, and made a short address.

Before calling upon the various Hon. Secretaries and Instructors, the Chairman drew attention to the sterling work performed by these people on behalf of the Club and members.

George Jackson then addressed the meeting on the rules of the Club, particularly referring to subscriptions, and arrears. He also made a point that far too many sections were sending postcards to members advising them of events, and team selection, and said that this was all wrong, the proper place for these details was the Club

Hotel Board. Regarding activities, Mr Jackson said that many boys were not actively engaged in the Club, and would have to improve on this, or would be asked to appear before the Committee. He concluded by referring to the splendid dental facilities available in the Club, and asked members to contact him for an appointment with the dentist.

Fred Lee then spoke on Football, Tennis, and Squash. He gave details of teams' achievements last season, and referred in particular to the winning of both Senior and Junior Federation Cups, and the Juniors' success in reaching the final of the Winchester Cup. The Club had reached the final of the Federation Tennis competition, and he informed members that coaching facilities were available. Regarding Squash, Mr. Lee said we had very fine facilities, and instanced the successes gained by Reg Jennings, as an example of practice and keenness.

Ron Hill then spoke on Cricket, and informed the meeting that the season just concluded was one of the greatest in the history of the Club, the Senior & Juniors had reached the finals of the Federation competition, the Senior winning. He referred to the very fine fixture lists against good class Clubs, and to the

splendid coaching & practice facilities available, he concluded by saying that Cricket, more than any other sport, required constant practice.

Mr. E. B. Barron then made a short, amusing speech, endorsing all that Fred Lee had said about Tennis and Squash. He also referred to the splendid performances of the Otters who had a brilliant year, finishing them the best of luck and success in the Federation finals to take place a few days later. Mr. Barron paid tribute to the sterling work performed over a great many years by Tom, and Eddie Hurley, and to the successes of the Old Boys at Water Polo.

Mr. R. F. Shan-Kennedy in his talk said that his experiences in the Club had taught him that members were divided into three groups, the very good, the good, and those who were not much good at any activities. He said that the most important thing for members was to 'have a go', no matter how poor they were, this was the spirit of the Club, and the best way of enjoying all that the Club had to offer.

Mr. A. J. Bishop then spoke on Drama in the Club, this was he said, a small group, but an enthusiastic one, with ambitions for the future. He gave details of

forthcoming productions by the group, and the improvements to the stage. Mr. Bird, appealed for more members to take up drama & Speech training, and gave instances how these activities could help a boy in life.

Les Golding next spoke on Athletics, he said that his remarks were not entirely intended for the Hornies, but for all members, they must all take a keen interest in the Club, and play a more active part, there were too many boys watching others do all the work. He instanced Reg Bascombe as an example to other members of hard training & perseverance.

Sir Edward Cadogan from the Chair then said that he was very impressed by the number of successes gained in all activities, and then referred to the splendid facilities provided in the Club & the Sports Ground, for members. He asked members to take especial care of the equipment and apparatus. Sir Edward referred to the memorial meeting held in the summer to the late Mr. David Shaw Kennedy, saying that the speeches made, were some of the finest tributes he had ever heard, to the work of one man. He said that in losing David Shaw Kennedy, the Club had suffered a terrible loss indeed, and then paid tribute to his magnificent work in the Club over many years.

Sir Edward then referred to the life work of Major Villiers for the Club, saying that no man could possibly have done more.
