# DW/3 Lappings, Lemel & Sweeps

Administrative/Biographical History: Hatton Garden is a street and commercial area in the Holborn district of the London Borough of Camden, close to the boundary with the City of London. Hatton Garden is famous as London's jewellery quarter and the centre of diamond trade in the United Kingdom. This specialisation grew up in the early 19th century, spreading out from its more ancient centre in nearby Clerkenwell. Today there are nearly 300 businesses here in the jewellery industry and over 55 shops, representing the largest cluster of jewellery retailers in the UK. The largest of these businesses was De Beers, the international family of companies which dominated the international diamond trade. Their headquarters were in an office and warehouse complex just behind the main Hatton Garden shopping street. In 1962 Lawrence Graff of Wittelsbach-Graff Diamond fame opened his first retail jewellery store here.

Summary: PP describes his early memories of Hatton Garden when he visited his father's workshop, the skills he learned from being in his father's workshop, early aspirations to be an artists thwarted by the outbreak of WWII, instead he joined his father at the workshop to become a jeweller, being called up to the army when he turned 21 and realising he was still a foreigner in the eves of the government, how his father came to London from Antwerp and set up his workshop, the kinds of jewellery he made for decades until Thatcher introduced extremely high interests rates forcing him to retire, winning a De Beers designing competition, the different jewellers he knew, he importance of apprenticeships, the first piece of jewellery he made

Summary: RL describes her three generations of family who worked in Hatton Garden beginning with her grandfather, her early memories of Hatton Garden, where she would go with her father while he met different dealers, her parents setting up a business in Hatton Garden in the late 1980s and working there in the summers, meeting Mitzi - a well-known local jeweller, the history of Hatton Garden beginning with its Elizabethan roots to its becoming internationally known as the centre of jewellery manufacturing and trade to its current role in the trade, the River Fleet which is buried underneath Hatton Garden, her experience of researching Hatton Garden and her writing process, the history of Jewish people working with diamonds, the role of the Huguenots and Italians manufacturers in the area, her book 'Diamond Street', the importance of reputation, the nature of family businesses
