DW/11 The Weekend Millionaires

Name of Creator: Digital:Works, community history group; Various.

Administrative/Biographical History: 'The Weekend Millionaires: An Oral History of the Thames Lightermen' is is a collection of oral histories of former lightermen and their families. These histories were also video recorded and together with archival footage they were used to make a documentary about those who worked for generations on the River Thames before the lighterage industry ended in the 1990s.

Themes covered in the histories and the film are the difference between lightermen and watermen, the family histories of lightermen, working conditions, the various cargos coming in and out of London, and the camaraderie among the lightermen. Also discussed were apprenticeship, the necessity of working with the tides of the Thames, and amassing knowledge the Thames' curves and bridges. The project highlights the effects of containerisation and how the lighterage industry closing affected lightermen and riverside communities.

'The Weekend Millionaires' was a collaborative project between the charity digital:works and Year 6 Children from St George the Martyr and Westminster Cathedral Primary Schools. The children learned interviewing and documentary skills while conducting the oral histories. The project includes 22 oral histories and one documentary.

Name: Alan Lee Williams Recording length: 56min Summary: ALW describes moving as a child from Deptford to Blackheath; his father working as a lighterman and his grandfather as a master mariner birth on the Thames; can trace family history working on the Thames back to 1909; during WWI lighermen were considered so important that they were not drafted, and the industry was so important to the war effort that apprenticeship lengths were shortened, there was also an agreement between lightermen and the Royal Navy; the process of securing his apprenticeship at 14 years old; different working conditions for different companies; what it was like working with his father as ship master; working 24 hour shifts as a cabin boy on a tug; different skills and tools he worked with on a tug; being happy that he'd earned enough to attend the theatre in a theatre box, which also earned him the nickname 'Shakespeare' at work; falling into the Thames by Tower Bridge; accidents at work; difference between lightermen and watermen; having to stand up to dockworkers who wanted to steal cargo; the length of the journeys, and how he'd spend his free time reading on the long trips; difficulty of navigating in the dark, including navigating near gas lamps; participation in acting troupe 'The Webster Players'; importance of having a good whistle or being able to whistle well: trade unions and strikes; entering political life after being a lighterman, becoming an MP for Greenwich; joining the Royal Air Force; his feelings about the lightermen industry ending

Name: Alan Pettit Recording length: 57min Summary: AP describes the difference between a lighterman and a dockworker; being born in Hertfordshire because his mother was evacuated due to WWII; growing up in Poplar

then moving to Hainault; family history of lightermen; began his apprenticeship in 1956; first job as a tug boy working for Union Lighterage; different paperwork used for different cargo and the different docks which dealt with different cargo; working with the tides; different certifications he received over the years; enjoying football (West Ham) and motorcycling; nicknames among lightermen; companies and wharves which are no longer in business; his responsibilities as an apprentice on a tugboat; learning the river and the bridges, navigational aids, loading craft, preparing the craft for loading; how lightermen were paid; working with dangerous cargo; camaraderie at work; different 'characters' he worked with; the decline of the lighterage industry; containerisation

Name: Barry Bullock Recording length: 38min Summary: BB describes his parents' jobs; his childhood community in East Ham; origins of the term 'lighterman'; his family history (25 generations) of lightermen; effect of WWII on the lighterage industry; his apprenticeship; learning the river and bridges: working conditions: going overboard twice; witnessing a grievous accident; camaraderie between lightermen; nicknames; whistling and sound signals; trying to be a 'mod', buying lots of clothes and a scooter; thieving; strikes; containerisation; working for Port of London Authority; feelings on the lighterage industry ending; how the Thames and riverside communities have changed over the years; roles of women on the river
